## Prep Work

Register for and complete your Purdue Global orientation.

## Class Readiness

Make sure your computer is ready and that you have all the required software.

Log in to Purdue Global Campus and tour around the virtual campus.

Familiarize yourself with the online classroom, the seminar tool, and your Purdue Global email.

Use the preview period to access your classes, review the syllabus, map out assignments, and get ready for class a few days before your start date.

Ensure you understand your degree plan and the courses you will need to complete to graduate.

Complete any program-specific requirements before your start date.

If seeking financial aid, complete all required steps to secure funding.

If transferring credits from a prior college, complete all required steps to have credits evaluated.

If seeking credit for prior work experience, start the process to have experience evaluated.
